MARK KRAWCZYK (Director) a seasoned theatre practitioner with 20+ years of experience, excels in acting, arts management, directing, and teaching. His acclaimed acting career spans renowned theaters like Utah Shakespeare Festival, The Shakespeare Theatre, Folger Theatre, Theater J, Martha's Vineyard Playhouse, and more. He co-founded Without Gas, a European-based company that toured England, Slovakia, and Poland with

adaptations of central European avant-garde plays. Mark's influence extends to film and TV, including the Netflix series "House of Cards." He recently acted in *The Caretaker* by Harold Pinter with The Edge of The Universe Theater in Bethesda, MD. He's enriched young minds through teaching at institutions like Towson University and Boston Conservatory at Berklee. 
