MEET THE CREATIVE TEAM



ALICIA HAYMER (Director) is a Nashville native and Fisk alum, has been a part of the Nashville arts scene for 20+ years. In the many years that Alicia has been on stage in Nashville, she's worked with Nashville Children's Theater, The Amun Ra Theater, SistaStyle Productions, Tennessee Women's Theater Project, Destiny Theater Experience, and the Nashville Repertory Theater, among other wonderful play houses in Nashville. Alicia began

writing in 2016, with her short play, Power to the People, making its debut in New York, New York in the fall of 2017, as part of the My America plays workshop. Her first full length play, Heavy was developed in the Nashville Rep's Writing Room, and her latest full-length play Free and Public Citizen was written in 2019, as part of the Tennessee Playwright's Studio. She's also written commissioned work for the Nashville Children's Theatre, and the University of Maryland's School of Music in partnership with the Annapolis Opera. Alicia's had the pleasure of directing with Actor's Bridge Ensemble (Detroit '67), as well as Street Theatre (Eclipsed, Sweat), Infinity Center Presents (The Colored Museum), Nashville Repertory Theater (School Girls; or, The African Mean Girls Play), Chattanooga Theatre Centre (Joe Turner's Come and Gone and The Piano Lesson), and Tennessee Playwright's Studio (Don't Look Black). She's also directed developmental works with Tennessee Playwright's Studio, Destiny Theatre Experience, and MTSU's In Process: A Creative Writing Series. In addition to directing, Alicia is also a mentor for the Young Voices Competition, a monologue competition using the work of contemporary Black writers. In 2020, she became Co Artistic Director of Verge Theater Company. With them, she has developed The Black Future Project, which provides opportunity for young artists to receive professional development in writing, producing, and performing. 

CELEBRATING THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF BLACK ARTISTS

at Chattanooga Theatre Centre

As with most Southern institutions, the Chattanooga Little Theatre was slow to embrace racial diversity in its productions. It was not until the mid-1970s that Black artists were included in productions at CTC. Those early interracial productions were presented in the Circle Theatre and were produced in partnership with the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.

In 1974, Cecily Menifield, a Black student at UTC, directed In White America, a play focused on themes central to the Black experience, as a coproduction with the Little Theatre. In that same season, Blood Knot was directed by Richard Reid (seen below), a Black actor who returned to Chattanooga from a professional acting career.



In recent years, CTC has adopted the goal of embracing diversity as one of its guiding principles. Chattanooga Theatre Centre encourages diverse and inclusive casting, as well as diversity within its creative teams - including directors, musical directors, musicians, choreographers, set and costume designers, backstage crews, and front-of-house volunteers.

Chattanooga Theatre Centre looks forward to the next century of expanding and improving our efforts to create a diverse theatre community that is welcoming to all.


