





1930S: SURVIVING AND THRIVING at Chattanooga Theatre Centre

The Little Theatre, as we were known in the 1930s, was located in an old fire hall in Downtown Chattanooga. Having their own space allowed the theatre to be more flexible with its programming, but it also came with challenges. At this time, the structure of the theatre was such that the only paid positions were the directors. The actors, technical artists, and board members who ran the business were all volunteers, many working full-time jobs in other industries.

Property ownership would not be the only difficulty The Little Theatre would face in its first decade of existence. The effects of the Great Depression were headed for Chattanooga in 1929, and there was no certainty the organization would survive the national economic crisis. At first, The Little Theatre stumbled, limiting the number of shows produced for several years. However, by 1935 they were producing more plays than ever before. As a testiment to the need for an artistic space in the community, The Chattanooga Times spared nothing in their affection for the theatre. In July 1932, one reporter at the Times wrote: "Even in the midst of an unusual concentration upon the problems of business . . . Chattanooga has not forgotten the less tangible but important needs of cherishing and developing the sources of art and culture. The Little Theatre is a factor in the things that go to make and keep alive consciousness of being something more than cogs in a bewildering industrial machine."

In 1933, the theatre produced a marionette show titled *Prisoners of Neptune*. This "dramatic fantasy" was written and directed by Malcolm Chisholm, and produced with the talents of many others in the community.

One particularly facinating quote describing this era appeared in The Chattanooga Times in 1932: "Much of the excellence of Little Theatre plays may be traced to the fact that no bounds have been set upon the places from which casts may be drawn. Lawyers, doctors, clerks, stenographers, mechanics,

salesmen, government employees, detectives, housewives, society leaders, bank executives, students- all mingle in the democracy of The Little Theatre."

No doubt, The Little Theatre's survival and success throughout the Great Depression was due, in large part, to the continued involvement of prominent Chattanoogans. Because of the emotional and financial support from generous individuals, hardworking volunteers, and our resilient patrons, The Little Theatre would thrive and survive one of the most difficult times in United States history and continue on to become one of the oldest continuously operating community theatres in the country.
