

friends and family. He would like to thank his family and friends for their continued support. Lastly, he would like to thank the cast for making this journey one to remember! Do one!





MEET THE CREATIVE TEAM



NESHAWN CALLOWAY (Music Director) is completing her twenty-third year as Vocal Music Director at Center for Creative Arts (CCA) where she conducts six vocal ensembles. Her vocal ensembles consistently score superior ratings at regional, state and national festivals and her students consistently place in regional and state honor choirs. Neshawn was recognized by the CMA (County Music Association) Foundation as a music teacher of excellence in 2020. In addition

to her work at CCA she also teaches private lessons and is often a guest soloist in churches in the Chattanooga area. As a performer Neshawn is the lead singer for a neo-soul band, "Sound Advice." She has performed with CSO Big Band and CSO Orchestra as well as Choral Arts of Chattanooga. She has appeared at Nightfall, Riverbend and the Levitt Amp Concert Series with her band. Known throughout Chattanooga for her performance of the music of blues legend, Bessie Smith, Neshawn created an educational performance that highlights the life and music of The Empress. In 2012 she traveled to Hamm, Germany where she performed a concert of jazz and blues to a sold-out audience. In May of 2022, she returned to Hamm, with 21 students to perform for our sister city. Neshawn's experience with CTC extends back to 2017 in the cast of *The Wiz* where she played "Aunt Em" and "Glinda." She has also served as music director for *Once on This Island, Jr., The Lion King, Jr., Aladdin Jr.*, and *The Color Purple*.



CRYSTAL NEWSON (Choreographer) is a native of Chattanooga, Tennessee. She is currently a professional dancer, choreographer and teaching artist in her local area. Crystal has recently become a part-time dance educator for her alma mater, Center for Creative Arts, and an Artistic Director of The Katherine Dunham Juba Dance Ensemble. During her years as a dance major at Center for Creative Arts she began to develop her love and skill in choreography. Newson studied many

styles in dance, which allowed her to pull inspiration from her training and experience to create stories with her movement. After graduating from CCA, Ms. Newson began her work as a dance instructor/Choreographer working with many dance programs such as; Project Motion, Choo Choo kids, Chattanooga Ballet, Ballet Tennessee, Lee University, Covenant College and many more. Newson has also worked in the musical industry creating work for *Hello Dolly!*, *Hairspray, Mary Poppins*, *Godspell* and many other showcases for The Choo Choo Kids of Center for Creative Arts.



RODNEY VAN VALKENBURG (Prodution Director and CTC Executive Director) started his career at The Little Theatre in 1983 as the first full-time Youth Theatre director. He served for more than 18 years as Director of Programs and as Director of Education. Before coming back to the CTC in 2020, he was Vice President of ArtsBuild. Highlights at the CTC include the Youth Theatre representing the U.S. at the International Theatre Camp in Zelenograd, Russia.

Rodney also served as Artistic Director of the camp in Narva, Estonia. He has directed over 80 plays at the CTC, including many Youth Theatre productions, *Vintage Hitchcock, Boeing Boeing,* and *Annie.* He has also been seen onstage in *It's a Wonderful Life, Newsies, A Room with a View, Les Misérables, The Producers,* and *Anything Goes.* Rodney has been a participant in the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts' Partners in Education program since 2003 and served on the program's Advisory Committee. He served as the coordinator for the Chattanooga-Hamilton County Ensuring the Arts for Any Given Child site, also through the Kennedy Center. Rodney has also served as a grant panelist with the National Endowment for the Arts and the Tennessee Arts Commission. He serves as Tennessee State Captain for the Americans for the Arts' National Arts Action Summit in Washington, D.C. He is a past president of the Tennessee Theatre Association and served on the executive committee of the Southeastern Theatre Conference. He received his MFA in Acting and Directing from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Rodney shares his passion for theatre with his son, Jake, who lives in Atlanta.



KIMBERLY REYNOLDS (Costume Designer) has volunteered regularly for the past nine years at Chattanooga Theatre Centre as a performer, stage manager, fonrt-of-house worker, and costume designer. Her CTC production credits include August Wilson's *The Piano Lesson* (Stage Manager), *The Color Purple* (Costume Designer), *A Civil War Christmas* (Winning the Debut Actress award), *Gem of Ocean* (Winning the Outstanding Leading Actress and Audience



community, gain exposure to different skill sets, and the incredible staff!"



1920s: JUST THE START

at Chattanooga Theatre Centre

At the beginning of the 20th Century, there was a general feeling across the country that theatre was getting too "commercial." The Theatrical Syndicate had a stronghold on the landscape of live theatrical performances at this time, owning and controlling many theatres across the U.S. Communities wanted a theatre that produced plays focusing on issues relevant to them, run by and for locals. And from that need, The Little Theatre Movement was born. Little Theatres began popping up all over the country, and Chattanooga was no different.



In the 1920s, Othneil Brown, a reporter at *The Chattanooga Times*, had a notion of just such a local theatre to help bolster Chattanooga's arts scene. With help from banker and local philanthropist E. Y. Chapin Jr., they wrote letters to prominent Chattanoogans to help support the creation of the young organization. In December of 1923 we were founded as the Little Theatre, and work on our first production began!

"Dear Me" premiered in April 28, 1924 at Memorial Auditorium as the first production of the Chattanooga Little Theatre. The show received rave reviews by the Chattanooga Times, but it wasn't without its snafus- A door fell clean out of the set during a performance. Thankfully, a stage carpenter was on hand and fixed the door while they continued the play. As they say, the show must go on!

The Little Theatre grew in popularity and success, producing multiple plays a year performed in highschool gyms and in the Bijou Theatre. The organization ran on memberships back then, and grew to over 200 patrons. After several complaints of disorganization and subpar performance venues by actors and audiences, the Board of Directors knew we could do much more with a space of our own. In 1926 the Little Theatre moved into its very own building, an abandoned firehall leased from the city. While it required some retrofitting to make the space theatrical, it would provide a suitable home for us for the next three decades.
